

### **EKPHRASTIC WORLDBUILDING** (FICTION) (GRADES 9-12)

Facilitator: Meaghan Loraas

In this workshop, we'll learn how to build a fictional world and add texture to imaginary settings. Whether our story takes place on a modern-day Earth or on a planet far, far away, a fictional world and how characters interact with it takes some planning! Using details taken directly from art in the space, students will leave the workshop with an invented setting to use as they please.

### WRITING FROM ART (POETRY) (GRADES 9-12)
